Climate Change and Food Security in Senegal: « Saisine Model"

In Senegal, a controversy over the food security situation arises often in a context of climate variability, every two or three years, between the Ministry in charge of agriculture and the Executive Secretariat of the National Council for Food Security.

Beyond political contingencies, the question of the technical or scientific relationship between climate change and food security arises, fundamentally.

This communication, after having made a reminder on the origins and manifestations of climate change, characterizes from the facts and data of the actors, their more or less direct interactions. In addition, it identifies other indirect referral approaches that could serve as a research avenue for a better understanding of the phenomenon.
